The 1916<sup>1</sup> edition showed a falling off in wit and imagination, though Ed Wynn carried his end of the show, and there were novelties in the form of revivals of clogging and buck-and-wing dancing, an "Olympian ballet" suggesting *Scheherazade*, and a memorable tune by Sigmund Romberg called "Pretty Baby."... Ed Wynn sought to repair an inner tube with a saw and a hammer in a sketch entitled "A Modern Garage." The humor generally, however, was on the level of cracks about Philadelphia and the Ford car and fighting with one's wife; and the girls who still did boys' parts in the chorus were coming to seem old-fashioned.
